Dear Parents/Guardians:

Welcome to Crossland High School. We are committed to Excellence in Education at Crossland High School. Together, our faculty and staff developed a vision and mission statement aligned with our values and beliefs. Literacy is our focus as well as improving our school culture and climate. As a result, we have a new mantra “Achieve then Lead.” We are looking forward to a new beginning where stakeholders are involved in the structures and systems we have in place to maximize the academic, social, and emotional growth of all students.

Crossland High School will create Ambassadors of Peace by having a “No More Violence” campaign: One School, One Community, and One County at a Time. We will promote peace in our school, neighborhoods, and community. As responsible global citizens, we will make sure our students help create a better and more peaceful world. All students will be inquirers, thinkers, knowledgeable, communicators, and principled, caring, open-minded, risk-takers, balanced and reflective.

The uniform policy for School Year 2017-2018 is as follows:

- **Freshmen boys** will wear white polo shirts, black pants, black belt and closed toe shoes. **Freshmen girls** will wear white polo shirts, black pants or a black skirt (knee length) and closed toe shoes. The students will only be allowed to wear a black, red, white or gray sweater or light jacket in the classroom. **No other colors are allowed.**
- **Sophomore boys** will wear gray polo shirts, black pants, black belt and closed toe shoes. **Sophomore girls** will wear gray polo shirts, black pants with a black belt or a black skirt (knee length) and closed toe shoes.
- **Juniors** will continue to wear the solid gold collared polo shirts, black pants with a black belt, and closed toe shoes. The black belt and the closed toe shoes are mandatory. **Seniors** will wear red polo collared shirts with black pants a belt.
- **All boys** will need a white collared button down shirt with a black bow tie for Dress for Success Days. **All girls** will need a white collared button down shirt and a black skirt or pants for Dress for Success Days. Dress for success day is the last Friday of every month.

The outer wear should not have letters, logos, pictures, etc. The outerwear should be solid black, red, gray, or white. **Leggings are not allowed to be worn** at all. Athletics gear, sweat pants, and head gear are not allowed. Students can only wear head gear for religious or health purposes.

Students will also have to wear an ID to every class. The first ID will be given to them during the first week of school. If the ID is lost, they will have to pay \$5.00 for the replacement ID. Students

will not be allowed in class without an ID. It is very important that they receive a temporary one if they lose the original ID.


Our start time for classes is 7:45 a.m. The students departure time is 2:25 p.m. Your child's bus schedule will be mailed to you prior to school opening. Make sure they know the bus number to return home. The first day of school for freshman is September 5, 2017. This will be an orientation day. They will report to the cafeteria to receive their schedules and have an opening session with the administrators.

On September 6, 2017, 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade report to the cafeteria and 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade report to the gym. If your child is eating breakfast, they can report to the cafeteria. The bell will ring at 7:35 a.m. every morning for the students to go to their lockers and class. Students are considered late if they arrive after 7:45 a.m. All late students must report to Room 6 to get a yellow slip to class. Students must wear their uniforms to school. Once they arrive, they cannot leave campus to go across the street to McDonald's or other establishments.

Our assistant principal staff includes Mrs. Denice Nabinett, 9<sup>th</sup> grade assistant principal, Mr. Brett Givens 10<sup>th</sup> grade assistant principal, Ms. Lena Fraser 11<sup>th</sup> grade assistant principal and Cornithia Swanson is the 12<sup>th</sup> grade assistant principal. Our IB Coordinator is Dr. Melissa Boyd and our Instructional Lead Teacher is Ms. Candace Slobonik. Our leadership team is here to support you and your students to ensure success at Crossland High School. We frequently monitor the instructional program and have structures and systems in place to address the needs of all students.

This year I am implementing a customer service survey that I would like for you to complete after every visit to Crossland or phone call response. It is very important that you know we care about you and your children. Our goal is to develop trust by caring, being open, honest, reliable and competent.
