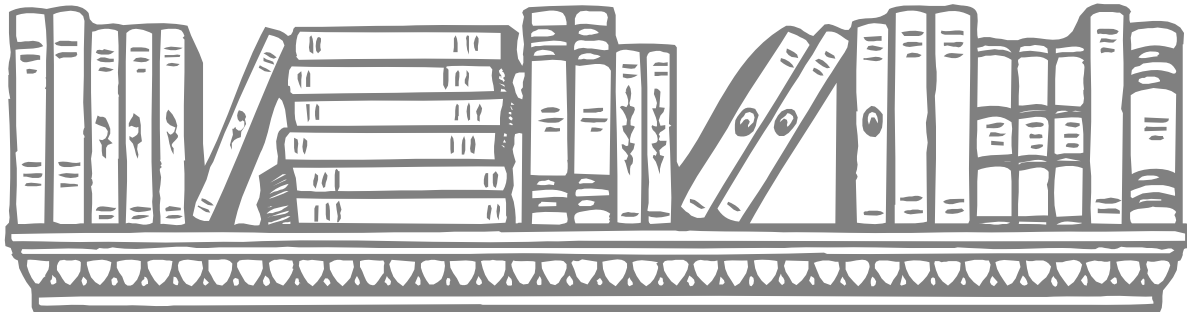

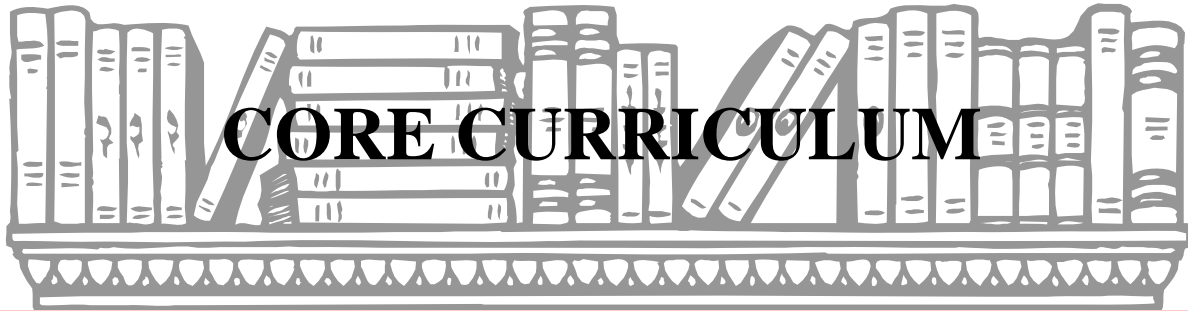
Administrative Procedure 5123.2

1. From grade nine to ten, a student must have a total of five units of credit, including one credit of English.
2. From grade ten to eleven, a student must have a total of ten units of credit, including two credits of English, one credit of mathematics, one credit of science, and one credit of social studies.
3. From grade eleven to twelve, a student must have a total of fourteen units of credit, including three credits of English, two credits of mathematics, one credit of science, one credit of social studies, and be able to fulfill all requirements not to exceed nine credits per year, for a Maryland High School Diploma in June.

Board Policy 6161.1

No pupil may be advanced to a higher grade unless the pupil, in addition to receiving a passing grade:

1. Returns such textbooks and other similar educational materials, as were originally furnished, to appropriate school personnel in a satisfactory condition, or
2. Reimburses the school for damaged textbooks or other similar educational materials, or
3. Reimburses the school for lost textbooks or similar educational materials at the full cost of replacement, without any reduction for depreciation or age of the lost textbook or educational material.
4. Makes other satisfactory arrangements with the principal concerning the textbooks or other similar educational materials.

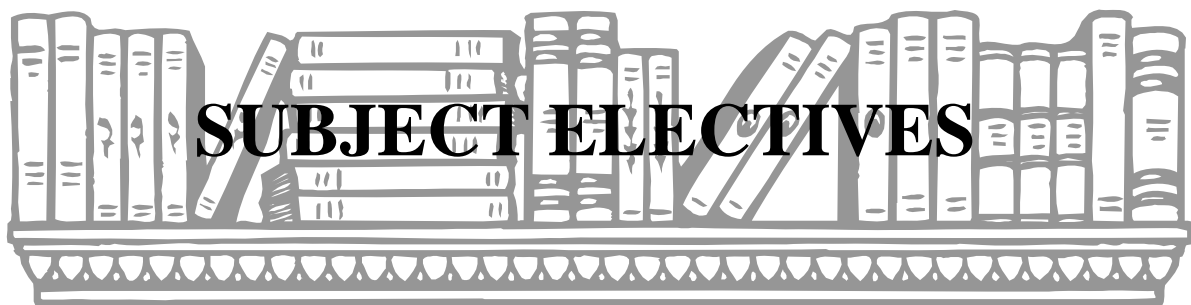
