Teachers will use the appropriate resources available, specifically (Really Great Reading Resources (K-2), Benchmark Workshop (3-5), Lexia Core 5 intervention (Kindergarten - Third Grade), DIBELS (K-3) and i-Ready teacher lesson resources (fourth - fifth grade) to provide explicit focus group instruction. Administration Team and Staff will conduct classroom walkthroughs to monitor progress with small group instruction quarterly. Administration Team will also monitor the usages of Tier 1 and Tier 2 instruction during collaborative planning. In addition, Deerfield Run is working with the English Language Support Team in order to increase teacher capacity with reading curriculum implementation.
