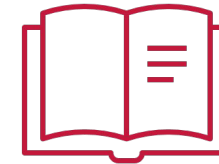

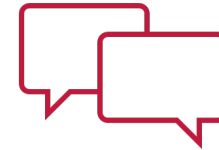

What did we learn?



Student Feedback

- 52.9% of staff say students “always” need help with reading and writing
 - 19.2% cited food insecurity; 14.6% needed help with clothing/shoes
 - 36.9% of respondents felt that learning was “always” connected to life outside the classroom



Staff Feedback

- 46.7% of staff agreed that emotional support is a key student need

Family Feedback

- 31.8% noted a need for English language instruction;
- 19.2% noted a need for legal services for immigrant families.
- 23.2% of respondents identified emotional support as a key student need;

Expand partnerships to include STEM and enrichment programs. Increase integration of real-world, career-connected learning.

Collaborative Leadership,
Shared Power, and Voice



Strengthen the Parent Leadership Organization (PLO). Host collaborative forums. Train staff to facilitate shared decision-making processes. Improve outreach to raise awareness about leadership opportunities.

Integrated Systems
of Support



Increase presence of on-site or referred mental/behavioral health services. Improve family awareness of what supports exist. Develop or expand partnerships for healthcare, ESL, legal aid, and family literacy.

Culture of Belonging,
Safety, and Care



Deepen trauma-informed practices. Increase family involvement and language access. Develop staff PD on cultural competence and inclusion.

Powerful Student and
Family Engagement



Increase regular communication using preferred methods (in-person, phone, text). Host family-focused events and invite community agencies. Improve marketing of events and their purpose to families
