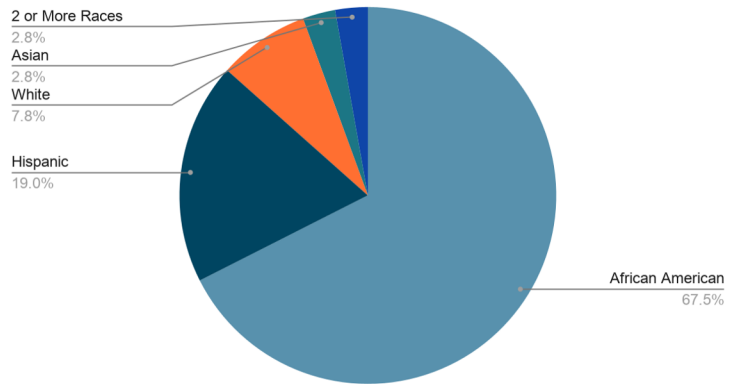
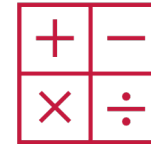

What did we learn?



- Students generally view Fort Washington Forest as a welcoming and inclusive school.
- Students report strong relationships with adults and feel they can communicate honestly with school staff.
- Mental-health/emotional support and expanded after-school opportunities remain areas for continued support.

- There is a clear foundation for academic and behavioral interventions.
- Partners are often willing and ready to help make learning more relevant.
- All stakeholders hold positive perceptions of the climate and culture at Northview Elementary.



- Families overwhelmingly view Fort Washington Forest as a welcoming community school.
- Families report strong, understandable communication from the school.
- Families identified after-school/childcare opportunities and community recreation resources as areas of need.



- Community members feel that Northview values communication and partner input.
- Partners feel recognize and appreciated

Priorities and Opportunities

Rigorous, Community-Connected Classroom Instruction and Expanded, Enriched Learning Opportunities



Fort Washington Forest will prioritize strengthening academic supports in reading, writing, and mathematics while expanding access to after-school and enrichment opportunities. Opportunities include connecting classroom learning to students' experiences, increasing family awareness of academic supports, and developing partnerships that provide meaningful extended-learning experiences. Survey results indicate a continued need for additional academic support, particularly in reading/writing and mathematics.

Collaborative Leadership, Shared Power, and Voice



Fort Washington Forest will strengthen opportunities for students and families to participate meaningfully in school leadership and decision-making. Priorities include increasing awareness of existing leadership opportunities, expanding family and student voice, and creating accessible ways for stakeholders to help shape school programs and priorities. Survey findings show that some students and families are unsure about the leadership and decision-making opportunities currently available to them.

Integrated Systems of Support



Fort Washington Forest will continue developing a coordinated system of academic, attendance, behavioral, mental-health, health, and basic-needs supports. Opportunities include strengthening connections to mental-health services, food and clothing resources, health and vision services, after-school/childcare programs, and English-language support for families. Staff survey responses particularly identified food insecurity, clothing/shoes, and English-language instruction for family members as areas of need.

Culture of Belonging, Safety, and Care

Fort Washington Forest has a strong foundation of belonging on which to build. The priority is to maintain a welcoming, inclusive, and supportive environment while strengthening culturally responsive practices, trusted student-adult relationships, and social-emotional and mental-health supports. More than 80% of respondents reported that the Community School **always welcomes everyone**, demonstrating a significant strength within the school community.

Powerful Student and Family Engagement



Fort Washington Forest will build upon strong family communication by creating additional opportunities for families to participate in school events, leadership, decision-making, and student learning. Outreach should emphasize the communication methods families prefer, particularly in-person communication, email/electronic communication, telephone calls, and text messaging.
