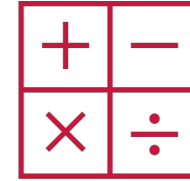

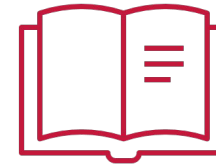

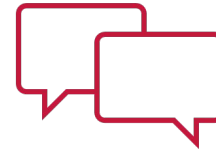

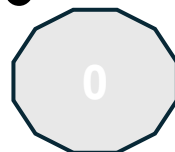

What did we learn?

Student Feedback

- Positive school climate and inclusivity
- 68% report that the school always welcomes everyone
- 42.2% say the school always helps families feel included
- Strong access to academic information
- 80.2% can easily check grades
- 77.4% can easily check attendance
- Availability of academic supports

Family Feedback
