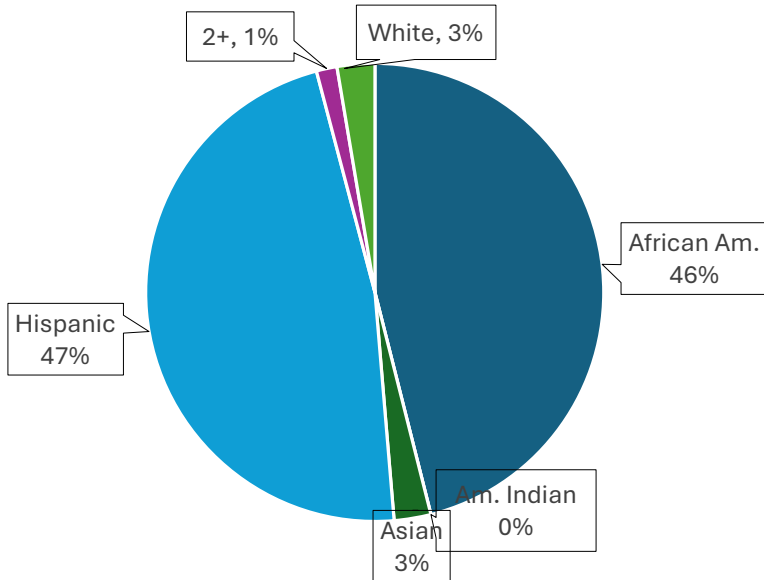
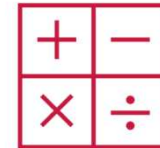

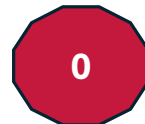

### What did we learn?

#### Student Feedback

- Unaware of support services
- Many report no needs
- Most have internet access
- Limited cultural representation
- Low trust in adults



#### Staff Feedback

- Concerned about academic gaps
- View school as welcoming
- Mental health systems lacking
- Rely on individual interventions
- Limited family engagement



#### Family Feedback

- Prefer digital communication
- Few invited to leadership roles
- Many unaware of services
- Underreport basic needs
- Mostly understand school messages

Add real-world, project-based lessons
