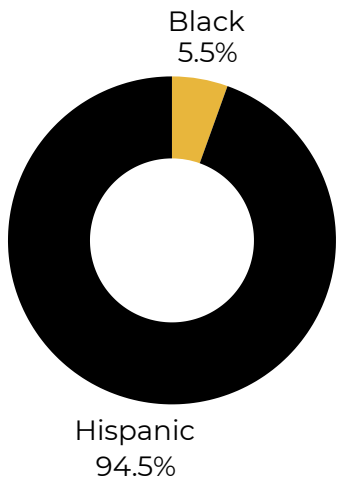


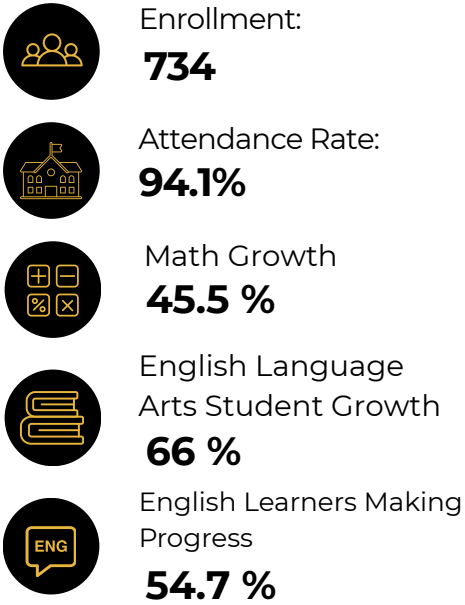

What did we learn?

Family Feedback

- Top needs: food, clothing, dental/vision care, emotional support
- 83.1% of families feel welcomed at school
- 73.6% say their culture is reflected
- 74.4% prefer in-person communication
- 20.5% request English classes
- 33.7% report food insecurity

Staff Feedback

- High SEL and mental health needs reported
- Gaps identified in math and science support
- 81.3% say student culture is reflected
- Limited family involvement in leadership structures
- Desire for more trauma-informed PD and wraparound supports

Priorities and Opportunities

Rigorous, Community-Connected Classroom Instruction and Expanded, Enriched Learning Opportunities

- Expand hands-on STEM and enrichment to support the 43% of families and 48.1% of staff citing academic support needs
- Build career-connected learning, as only 28.9% of families see real-life relevance
- Partner with local organizations for year-round, real-world enrichment

Collaborative Leadership, Shared Power, and Voice

- Increase leadership visibility; 44.4% of families are unaware of a PTO
- Host bilingual, flexible Steering Committee meetings to engage the 76.7% who feel uninvolved in decision-making
- Launch SGA to promote student voice and shared leadership

Integrated Systems of Support

- Strengthen SEL and trauma-informed care with staff PD and small group interventions
- Increase awareness of available services; 38% of families are unsure of access
- Offer family workshops on health systems, benefits, and emotional wellness

Culture of Belonging, Safety, and Care

- Build on positive culture reflection (81.3% staff, 73.6% families) with culturally relevant curriculum and events
- Expand SEL and mentoring to strengthen belonging and connections
- Boost adult-student support; only 61% of families say their child always has a trusted adult at school

Powerful Student and Family Engagement

- 83.1% of families feel welcomed—opportunity to deepen engagement
- Increase visibility of parent leadership (Steering Committee)
- Launch SGA to elevate student voice
- Offer incentives (childcare, food, recognition) to boost participation
- Survey families on preferred leadership roles
