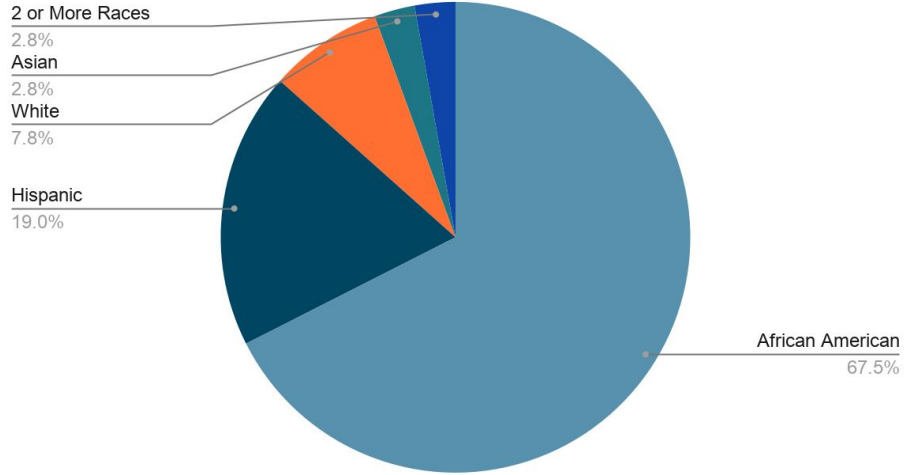
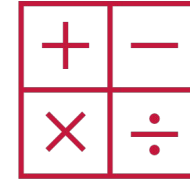

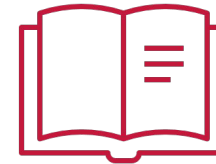

For Northview Elementary, the priorities center on making learning relevant and culturally responsive in the classroom. Also extending learning opportunities beyond the traditional school day. The school has a strong opportunity to position family engagement events as the connective tissue helping families understand instructional practices, participate in student learning, and access enriched opportunities that improve achievement.
