





Priorities and Opportunities

Integrated Systems of Support



Students:

- ~29% need emotional support
- ~22% need help feeling safe at home
- ~36% need nothing

Parents:

- ~15% need help with food, healthcare, or vision
- ~56% need nothing

Staff report students face:

- ~42% food insecurity
- ~32% lack clothes/shoes
- ~28% emotional issues
- ~27% need health care
- ~23% need dental care

Only 5% say families need nothing

It is recommended we continue providing education on mental health, self-advocacy, and tools to support student and family needs throughout the school year.

Culture of Belonging, Safety, and Care



Inclusion & Belonging:

- ~67% of students.
- ~81% of families.
- ~93% of staff say families feel included
- ~53% of students.
- ~49% of parents
- ~67% of staff say culture is reflected in education.
- ~90%+ across all groups say the school welcomes everyone.

It is recommended we continue strengthening a culture of belonging, safety, and care for all.
