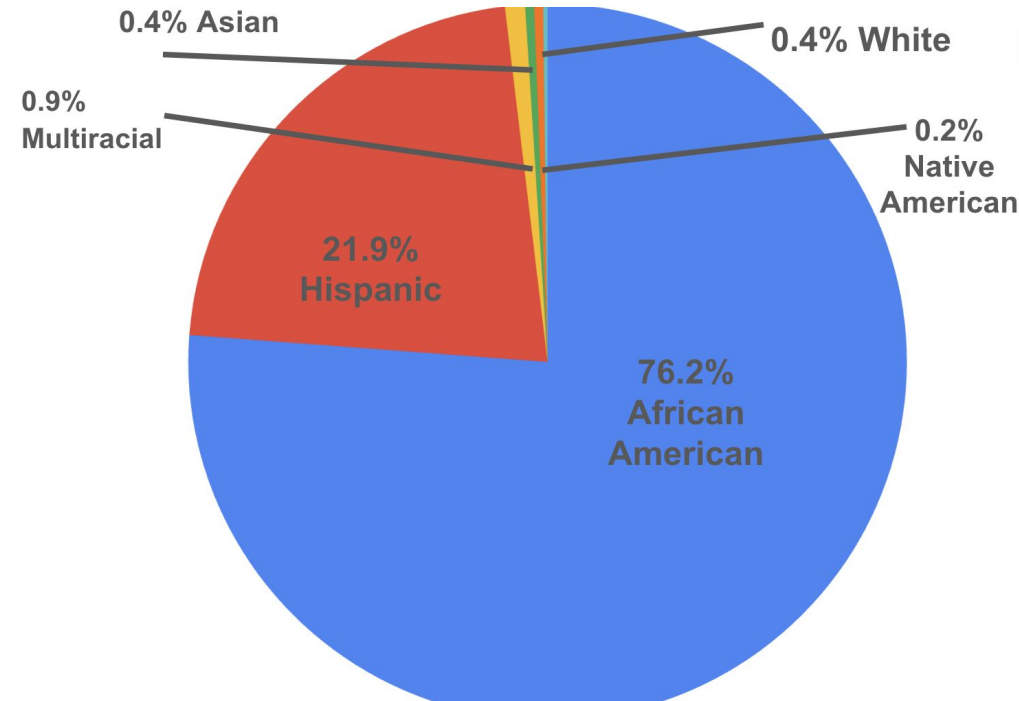
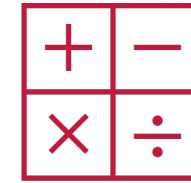

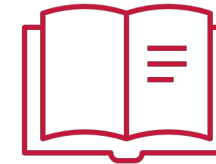

What did we learn?



- Many students feel they can speak openly and honestly with staff.
- Almost 90% of students feel school environment is welcoming and inclusive.
- Approximately 30% of students reported needing additional support for emotional well being.
- Students want more opportunities to participate in field trips, afterschool programs and summer programs.



- Staff confirm the presence of field trips, after-school programs, and summer programs, though access could be expanded.
- Many staff note that students feel comfortable being honest with adults, indicating a supportive school climate.
- Opportunities for students to participate in school decision-making could be strengthened.
- Staff report that systems are in place to support students struggling academically, but would like additional resources to support students in reading, writing and math.

- Access to affordable clothing, shoes and basic necessities for students.
- Opportunities to participate in school decision making and leadership roles.
- Support with consistent access to nutritious food.
- More extending learning opportunities for students.
- Assistance obtaining medical, dental and vision care.
- Additional programming for academic enrichment outside school hours.



- Expand wraparound supports (health, vision, dental, mental health) to reduce barriers to learning.
- Strengthen family engagement through leadership roles, decision-making, and bilingual communication
- Address basic family needs such as food, clothing, and internet access to improve equity and outcomes
- Enhance student voice and leadership by creating more opportunities for students to participate in decision-making and school activities

- Provide targeted interventions and enrichment in reading, writing, and math to close gaps while maintaining rigor.
- Offer more structured opportunities for students to participate in decision-making and lead school initiatives.
- Increase access to after-school, summer, and extended learning programs that build academic and life skills.
- Implement programs and partnerships that remove obstacles and promote consistent, engaged attendance.

Collaborative Leadership,
Shared Power, and Voice



- Create more structured opportunities for families to participate in school decision-making and leadership activities
- Establish regular forums, councils, or committees where students can share ideas and influence school programs and policies.
- Strengthen teacher and staff involvement in shaping school priorities, initiatives, and problem-solving strategies..

of Support



- Increase access to counseling, behavioral supports, and wellness programs to address emotional and behavioral needs.
- Strengthen tiered supports in reading, writing, and math through small-group instruction, individualized plans, and progress monitoring
- Strengthen partnerships that provide on-site or referral-based medical, dental, and vision care for students..

- Promote positive, trusting relationships between students, staff, and families through consistent, respectful interactions.
