Student Transfer Season

PGCPS will accept student transfer requests for the 2022-23 school year from Monday, April 25 (9 a.m.) through Friday, May 13 (11:59 p.m.). Parents and guardians of current PGCPS students can submit transfer requests electronically through the SchoolMax Family

Portal. Portal access is limited to parents and legal guardians with an active SchoolMax Family Portal account (username and password).

Parents and legal guardians of former PGCPS students can request a transfer form by contacting Student.Transfers@pgcps.org or 301-567-8751. Students entering Kindergarten who are not currently enrolled in a PGCPS PreK or Early Childhood Center (ECC) program must request a transfer form.

The Office of Student Records, Transfers and Archival Services will not accept transfer requests to schools that exceed state-rated capacity.


Addressing Food Scarcity: Family Food Boxes
