All Students to Return to In-Person Learning in January



With the release of the COVID-19 vaccine for children under age 12, we look forward to welcoming back all kindergarten through sixth grade students in late January for in-person teaching and learning.

While we awaited the approval of the pediatric vaccine, PGCPS is proud to have been the only school system in Maryland to offer virtual learning to every elementary-aged student who requested it. The K-6 Virtual Learning Program was always designed to be a temporary accommodation for families with younger children during this waiting period. It will now end Friday, Jan. 28, and students will return to school Monday, Jan. 31. Contact your child's school for more information.

COVID-19 Safety Measures Update



PGCPS encourages families to continue to actively take precautions to stay safe from COVID-19. In addition to getting the recommended vaccinations, please continue using these preventive steps:

- Wear face covering at all times inside the building.
- Wash hands often with soap and warm water for at least 20 seconds on both sides and between the fingers.
- Use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60 percent alcohol if soap and water are not available.
- Avoid touching eyes, nose and mouth.
- Avoid people who are ill.
- Disinfect high-contact surfaces, such as door knobs and tables.
- · Maintain an appropriate distance from others.
- Remain home if you are feeling ill.

PGCPS staff will continue taking the preventative measures listed above, using CDCrecommended cleaning protocols in buildings, utilizing virtual meetings when possible and monitoring for symptoms following CDC guidelines. Weekly random COVID-19 testing and screening will continue to help prevent outbreaks in schools. The Health Department's vaccination clinic at Wayne K. Curry Sports and Learning Complex has relocated to Prince George's Community College in Largo. Walk-ins for Dec. 16 and 17 will not be accepted. Appointments scheduled for Dec. 12-15 at the Sports and Learning Complex are being rescheduled for the new community college clinic.

The next round of first dose vaccines for children ages five and older begins Dec. 16 at school clinics throughout the county. Clinics will be held this week at eight elementary school sites

including: Baden, Bradbury Heights, Gladys Noon Spellman, Hillcrest Heights, John H. Bayne, Mary Harris "Mother" Jones, Thomas Stone and William Beanes.



Track Service Hours




