

Adrin Leak Named Maryland Teacher of the Year Finalist



Prince George's County Teacher of the Year Adrin Leak is a finalist for the 2021-2022 Maryland Teacher of the Year honors. Leak, a DuVal High School English Language Arts teacher, is among eight finalists statewide competing for the award. Criteria included instructional abilities; collaboration with colleagues, students, and families; community connections; leadership and innovation in and out of the classroom; and ability to articulate education issues and beliefs.

The winner will be announced Thursday, October 7 in a 30-minute Maryland Teacher of the Year television special airing at 8 p.m. on MPT2 and YouTube.

COVID-19 Vaccination and Testing Policy

The new employee COVID-19 vaccination and testing policy is one way that we are working to keep everyone safe. By now, employees should have shown proof of receiving the COVID-19 vaccination to their supervisors. This policy applies to PGCPs employees at all work sites, including substitutes and contractors.

Weekly Testing

Free weekly testing for unvaccinated employees will begin Monday, Sept. 13 at schools and designated central office hub locations. Both Rapid Antigen Tests and PCR Molecular Tests will be performed through a nasal swab. Rapid test results will be available within 15 minutes. PCR test results will be available in about 24 hours. Employees should report to work immediately after testing. More information about testing locations, times and protocols will be available soon.
