Hybrid Learning Delayed Amid Recent COVID-19 Surge

CEO Dr. Monica Goldson announced this week that Prince George's County Public Schools (PGCPS) will delay the distribution of a parent survey about moving to a hybrid instructional model for the second semester or continuing distance learning through the end of the school year. Hybrid learning will not begin in February.

Protecting PGCPS from Cyber Attacks

Cyber criminals have been targeting a number of school districts with increasingly sophisticated cyber attacks during this period of remote learning. To protect PGCPS from a cybersecurity breach, we must all continue to be vigilant when it comes to opening emails, clicking on links or downloading information from untrusted sources.

While PGCPS has strong firewall protections and antivirus software in place, cyber attacks typically occur through deceptively simple means where a carefully-crafted email message or fake email address — known as phishing emails — are used to lure the reader into believing the message has come from a trusted source. That's often all it takes to let malware or ransomware — malicious programs designed to disrupt and damage networks - into our system.

When reviewing your emails, make sure to verify the sender's identity. Be careful not to open emails, click on links or download information from an untrusted source.

Opportunities to Save for Retirement

Employees can save for retirement by participating in both a 403(b) and/or 457(b) plan.

Why save with one of these plans? You do not have to pay income tax on the allowable contributions until you begin making withdrawals from the plan, usually after your retirement. Investment gains in the plan are not taxed until distributed. Retirement assets can be carried from one employer to another in most states.

How can I participate?

Prior to contribution you must open an account with an <u>investment provider</u> participating in the plan and complete a <u>Salary Reduction Agreement form</u> online.
