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**UPPER MARLBORO**, **MD** – While schools are closed for the summer, Prince George's County Public Schools (PGCPS) continues its work by providing programs for students, preparing for the new school year, and helping families register new students.

Here is a list of important information families should know about summer programs and school system activities:

### **Credit Recovery Programs**

PGCPS offers credit recovery programs for middle and high school students. ### **Summer Meals for Children**

To help children receive the nutrition they need to learn, play, and grow over the summer, PGCPS provides meals for children ages 18 and under through the U.S. Department of Agriculture's (USDA) Summer Food Service Program. Five school sites will serve a free, nutritious lunch for children Monday through Thursday. Staff will serve breakfast from 8:30 to 9:00 a.m. and lunch is served from 11:30 to 12:30 p.m. There are no income requirements or registration required. The Summer Food Service Program will run from July 6 through August 5 at the following sites: Gladys Noon Spellman, Judge Sylvania Woods, Cooper Lane, Ridgecrest and Rogers Heights Elementary Schools.

# **Summer Office Hours**

PGCPS is operating on a four-day workweek schedule from Monday, June 22, through Friday, August 7. Schools and offices will be open Monday through Thursday with extended hours to provide students, parents, and employees more flexibility during the summer months. Core business hours are from 7 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. The week of June 29 – July 3 is a three-day workweek based on the observance of the July 4 holiday on Thursday.

### **Registering for School**

Parents and guardians are encouraged to register their child early at their boundary school to avoid extended wait times near the start of the school year. Bring proof of residency and your child's birth certification (for students entering prekindergarten or kindergarten), a signed immunization form from your child's doctor, and a copy of the transcript if your child is transferring from another school district.

### **New Immunization Requirements**

New state immunization requirements mandate that all students entering kindergarten and Grade 1 must have two doses of varicella (chickenpox vaccine), and students entering Grades 7 and 8 must have one dose of Tdap (tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis vaccine) and one dose of meningococcal vaccine. A free immunization clinic will be offered at the Back-to-School Fair (see below).
