BACKGROUND:

Comptroller Franchot will tour Gladys Noon Spellman Elementary School on Thursday, March 3, as part of his role as a member of the Board of Public Works, which approves public school funding. Gladys Noon Spellman will receive \$129,000 in state funding for a replacement elevator to help bring the facility into ADA compliance. Prince George's County Public Schools CEO, Dr. Kevin M. Maxwell and School District 4 Board Member, Patricia Eubanks, will join Comptroller Franchot on the tour.
