LETTER FROM THE GAME ON! PROGRAM MANAGER

What a year it has been for the Game On! program. Tennis and academic services expanded to 12 new partner sites. Our first ever tennis and college prep program launched this summer with an inaugural cohort of high school students. And more than 800 youth participants made impressive strides in athletic development, tennis fundamentals, and social and emotional learning (SEL) skillsets.

Students who are competent in SEL skills such as self-awareness and emotional regulation are more likely to succeed in school. As a result, we increased emphasis on SEL development for our tennis and academic enrichment activities in 2022-2023.



Stories from coaches at our Game On! sites highlight this focus on SEL. In the spring, I paired up with a six year-old student for a tossing and catching activity. When we reached the target number of catches, she turned to her classmates and declared, "we reached the goal because we are working as a team!"

Despite her young age, this student identified two character skills that she was practicing during the lesson – goal setting and teamwork. While in the moment she was focused on using those skills to play a game, I anticipate that she will find plenty of opportunities to apply them in bigger moments of her life.

Just like a simple tossing and catching activity, the Game On! program requires teamwork to achieve success. More than \$230,000 and over 300 hours of time were donated to the program this year, leading to immense growth in the scope and impact of our services.

We are excited to share this report with you that details successes, challenges, and upcoming opportunities for our program. Whether you are a Game On! student, family member, partner, volunteer, or donor, we appreciate your ongoing involvement in our programming, and we hope to see you on the courts soon!







2024 GOALS AND PROJECTIONS



"How many ball bounces in a row do you think you can get? By the end of the program, do you think you will be able to rally with a partner?" These are some of the questions coaches pose to help students practice goal-related behavior. We want students to take ownership of their learning so that they understand how to define and achieve their full potential. The Game On! department is no different, and we're excited to share below our 2023/2024 program goals!

Triple the number of students on the JTCC Future Champs pathway

...Because JTCC's pathway provides an opportunity for Game On! students to advance from a beginner to high performance level.

Have 80% of Game On! students report an intention to continue playing tennis

...Because we want to grow tennis participation in the D.C. metro community, whether at JTCC or elsewhere.

Reach 100 high school students

...Because "Tennis for Everybody" means "Tennis for Everybody." Game On! currently runs only one program serving low-income high school students in the DC metro area.

Register 80% or more Game On! participants who qualify for JTCC financial aid

...Because tennis has inherent socioeconomic barriers. It is important that the Game On! program, as much as possible, provides free programming to low-income students and families.

Score 90% or higher on social and emotional learning categories in end-of-programming surveys

...Because we strive to use tennis to promote our students' holistic growth in categories like relationship skills, healthy self-concept, goal-related behavior and self-agency.
