






COUNSELOR'S CORNER

As we transition into the end of another school year, I want to wish all Baden families a safe and fun-filled Summer! It has been an absolute pleasure getting to know our scholars and watching them grow throughout this year. Our focus this month has centered around mental health awareness and emotional regulation. Guidance lessons have assisted in providing students with healthy coping strategies and initiating safe conversations about the importance of mental health and finding long term support networks. Since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic in 2020, the percentage of youth seeking screenings for anxiety and depression has significantly increased (Website: Mental Health America). Students and families continue to face additional stressors with school work, relationships, and navigating major life changes. In order to ensure that children are receiving the proper support and resources during particularly stressful and challenging times, it is vital that parents and families: monitor any changes in their child's behavior, provide support/initiate safe conversations at home, and seek out professional assistance when needed. Additionally, it is equally important for parents to monitor their own mental health and find resources when necessary. 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NURSE CARTER'S CORNER

It's that time again! May is National Allergy and Asthma Awareness month. Allergies are among the most common medical conditions affecting children in the United States. According to the American College of Allergy, Asthma and immunology.

- 8.4 % of U.S. children under age 18 have allergic rhinitis (hay fever);
- 10% have respiratory allergies;
- 5.4 % have food allergies; and
- 11.6 % have skin allergies (hives or eczema)

With so many children living with one or more allergies, it's important for families to learn how allergies are managed in the school setting.

Schools are prepared to manage food allergies, environmental allergies and latex allergy. It's important to let the school nurse know (in writing – email works best) if your child has allergies. If their allergy is severe, and requires an Epi-pen, please make sure they have one in the nurse's office along with the signed Physician's Medical Order form (PMOF). Epi-pens save lives!!! Never leave home without one if one has been ordered for your child (or yourself).

If your child has asthma, please make sure they have a PMOF on file, along with an inhaler to be kept in the nurse's office. Almost all insurance companies will authorize 2 inhalers. One for home and one for school. Children in elementary school are not usually authorized to carry their inhaler on them. In order for an exception to be made this must be ordered by their physician and signed off by the school nurse-after consulting with the physician. Please do not send your child to school with an inhaler in their backpack or lunch box, this is in direct violation of PGCPS policy, and endangers the health of other students.

At the end of the school Year

- Plan to pick up any unused medication on the last day of school.
- Ask for any forms or health care plans that need to be completed for the next school year.
- If your child is transitioning to middle school, or will be attending a new school, plan to meet with the new school nurse in the first week of school.
 Use this opportunity to discuss your child's condition and provide the signed PMOF and any medication needed for the school year.
- If you're providing an epi-pen for the next school year make sure the medication will not expire before the end of the school year.

Although allergies and asthma can certainly make a child feel tired and/or unwell, it is not practical or in their best interest to keep children home from school during allergy season. Encourage your child to fully participate in school programming.

Together, (along with your child's physician) we can determine a plan of care that will assist your child in managing their symptoms in school.

SchoolMax

Please complete all Google Forms that will be sent home on the first day of school, especially the <u>Student Information/Emergency Card</u>. You will find the Student Information/Emergency Contact Form <u>here</u>. It is extremely important that we have accurate emergency information on file for every child. We are also asking for email addresses as a form of communication with our families. Sending newsletters and other mass correspondence in this manner will save us time and ensure communication more efficiently.

School Meals Application

The federal waiver that provided free lunch and breakfast for all students during the pandemic has expired. During the 2022-2023 school year, families who do not qualify for free or reduced lunch will pay for meals at school.

How to pay for lunch: MySchoolBucks is an online payment service through which parents can securely pay for meals and monitor student cafeteria purchases. Meal payments can be made online or through the mobile app. https://www.myschoolbucks.com/ver2/getmain.

We have a principal lunch account. If your child borrows the funds from the principal account. You must pay the account back as soon as possible. If you completed a free and reduced lunch application, Food and Nutrition Services will respond to you in reference to your application. Baden Elementary School does not have any information about your application.

Morning Routine/Drop-offs

If you are dropping off at the main entrance door, please do not park in or block our bus loop between 8:45am-9:30am. We need to ensure that our buses can arrive safely and on time each day. This means, you must park in the Baden Community Center parking lot for student drop-offs. Students will walk down the sidewalk from the parking lot and enter through the main entrance of the school building. The morning drop-off area will be monitored by staff until 9:30 a.m. Students who are car riders, and arrive after 9:30 a.m. must be escorted into the building and signed-in by a parent or guardian. Your cooperation is appreciated!

School Dismissal Routine

In order to ensure the safety of our students, children who are being picked up for early dismissal must be signed out each day. We check I.D. and match students according to those individuals listed on the emergency card or through

a written note only. <u>Students will not be permitted to be signed out for early dismissal after 2:45pm.</u>

Communicating Changes for How Your Child Goes Home

We will not be able to accept verbal permission or changes in your child's dismissal arrangements over the phone for safety reasons. You must communicate this in writing via email before 1:30pm to your child's teacher and to the Main Office staff.
